Carolina Park Elementary School Attendance Zone Proposed by Charleston County School District's Moultrie Constituent District 2 Board

Mount Pleasant, SC – The proposed attendance zone for the new Carolina Park Elementary School has been announced for the 2017 – 2018 school year. The new proposed attendance zone will include:

- Neighborhoods north of Faison Road and west of Highway 17 in District 2
- Neighborhoods north of Charleston National, including Charleston National, and east of Highway 17 in District 2.

Students entering their last year at Charles Pinckney Elementary School or Laurel Hill Primary School will have the option to remain at their current school for their last year or attend the new school. If they choose to remain at their current school for their final year, no transportation will be provided.

During the meeting, Moultrie Constituent District 2 Board of Trustees members will be present to receive input. Renderings of the new school will be displayed. Staff will be available that evening to answer questions about the new school.

After receiving public input, the board will deliberate and make a final decision on the attendance zone for the new school. The new attendance zone will be implemented for the 2017-2018 year.
