Kim Wilson Appointed Executive Director for the Secondary Learning Community

In addition to receiving the SC Principal of the Year honor, he's also earned the Administrator of the Year in 2006, Assistant Principal of the Year for 2002-2003, and Counselor of the Year for 1988-1989.

"Mr. Wilson is known for his dedication to his students and his passion for education," said CCSD Superintendent Gerrita Postlewait. "He is a superb leader and possesses the talent and skills to support all CCSD secondary schools in a most effective way."

Wilson will begin his new role as soon as a transition plan has been developed for Stall High School.
