# Wando High School Marching Band Places 8<sup>th</sup> at BOA Grand Nationals

**Charleston, SC** — The Wando High School Marching Band placed 8<sup>th</sup> in finals in the Bands of America Grand National Championships Saturday night in the Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Indiana with a score of 91.5 — it's highest score to date as a finalist at Grand Nationals. Wando was one of 13 marching bands in a prestigious group of finalists that included four previous national championship winners. The six chartered buses carrying the 300 students, staff, and chaperones arrived home Sunday evening to Wando High School with cheering parents and fans led by a Town of Mount Pleasant police escort and Charleston County Council Chairman Elliott Summey.

Wando's journey to making finals began Thursday evening when they performed in the preliminary competition with 100 high school marching bands, including at least 20 marching bands who had made finals previously and from all over the United States. Wando's Thursday evening performance placed them in the top 36 bands and semi-finals competition at 9:45 a.m. Saturday morning. During breaks between the semi-finals performances, Grammy Award winning artist and country singer Darius Rucker appeared on the Lucas Oil stadium monitors with a taped video of encouragement to all the performing bands, especially to his hometown Bands of Wando. At 5:30 p.m., during the semi-finals awards presentation, Wando learned that they placed in the top 13 bands and moved quickly to get ready for their 8:00 p.m. performance time as they moved on to the finals portion of the Grand National Championships.

Following the finals competition and retreat ceremony celebrating their 8<sup>th</sup> place finish, Wando Marching Band made their way back to the staging area, receiving high fives and congratulations from hundreds of supporters and fans. Mr. Eric Martin, the President and CEO of Music For All, a nationally recognized organization serving scholastic music performance, greeted Wando Band congratulating them on their finalist placement.

"Wando Marching Band is the poster child for what it means to have vision; creating confidence and joy for people who believe in the opportunity of

music," said Martin. "Keep doing what you're doing and as you enter adult hood, in any school that you are involved in, support the arts to help ensure remarkable and life changing experiences."

Bands of Wando Associate Director Lanie Radacke, said of Mr. Martin's appearance with the Wando Band students, "Eric Martin's personal visit to the Wando Band showed his sincere care and interest in our students, band program, and music education. What an honor to have him share his time and thoughts with our band family!"

Regarding the Grand Nationals experience and impressive results, Bands of Wando Director Bobby Lambert said, "We are so proud of our students. They did an amazing job in one of the most difficult Grand National finals in history. They have come farther than we could've imagined and we cannot wait to see what the future holds. Thank you so much to the community for showing us such amazing support throughout this process."

Mr. Jeff Handel, the other Associate Band Director with Wando, who leads their percussion ensemble said, "It's been a wonderful experience seeing this group of kids grow as musicians and performers over the past several months. The journey from writing the music to seeing these kids perform it at such a high level has been extremely rewarding."

Wando's performance, *Therefore*, centered on philosophical ideas like René Descartes' *I think, therefore I am.* It featured an original composition by Furman University Athletic Bands Director Jay Bocook, and visual elements including a 200-pound foam sculpture of a head from artist and longtime Wando band design collaborator, Michael Gray.

Three other bands from South Carolina also participated in Grand Nationals – Fort Mill, James F. Byrnes, and Nation Ford – but Wando was the only South Carolina school to make finals.

The next Bands of Wando events are their Holiday Concert Thursday, December 8, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. at Wando HS Performing Arts Center, and their marching performance in the Town of Mount Pleasant's Holiday Parade on Sunday, December 11, 2016.
