

PROHIBITED ITEMS

The Charleston County School District (CCSD) Student Code of Conduct and policies set forth rules that prohibit students from possessing certain items in the following circumstances:

- On school grounds during and immediately before or immediately after school hours;
- On school grounds at any other time when the school is being used by a school group;
- Off school grounds at a school activity, athletic function, or school-sponsored event; or
- At a school bus stop or when traveling to and from school on a school bus or other school vehicle.

Any item that is unlawful for a student to possess is prohibited on any CCSD property at any time.

PROHIBITED ITEMS*:

School identification card either altered or not belonging to a student

Inappropriate materials or magazines that promote discriminatory practices/speech or are sexually explicit or obscene

Alcohol/liquor

Tobacco - cigarettes, cigars, smokeless tobacco products, electronic cigarettes, vaporizers, and oils used in electronic vaporizers

Prescription or any non-prescription drugs without proper documentation

Drug paraphernalia

Illegal / controlled substances or substance represented as drugs, and/or a mood-altering substance

Gang-related items

Chemical compound or material which is categorically not permitted

Lighters, flammable materials, fireworks, explosives or bombs (including look-alike)

Miscellaneous weapons – toy guns, toy cap or pellet guns, or other devices that do not inflict injury

Any item, which although not usually thought of as a weapon, becomes one when used in a manner that could cause severe bodily injury (e.g., bat, metal chain, large stick, lead pipe)

Firearm ammunition/bullets

Weapons - knife, handgun, rifle, shotgun, pellet/paintball/stun/BB/flare/nail or airsoft gun, or any other type of weapon, device, or object which may be used to inflict bodily injury or death including, but not limited to, Taser, slingshot, blackjack, razors, ice pick, metal knuckles, box cutter, spiked glove, any mace derivative, tear gas device, or pepper spray
