<u>Charleston County School District Invites</u> <u>Principals to Listening Session</u>

Charleston, SC — The Charleston County School District (CCSD) will hold the second of six* listening sessions on Tuesday, June 20 at 5:00 PM. Tuesday night's session will include a principal panel roundtable selected by teacher leader advocacy groups.

Held at the district's administrative building, 75 Calhoun Street, the CCSD listening sessions are designed to collect input from key stakeholders including teachers, principals, parents, students, and area community and business leaders. The participation from these groups will be the foundation of a new strategic plan for the district.

"I am encouraged by the honest, open and productive feedback received from the teacher roundtable and audience last Thursday evening," said Superintendent Gerrita Postlewait. "These conversations are much needed, and together, we will create a new direction for the district."

All sessions are open to the public and include overflow seating as needed. The second portion of the session will be open for general comments from the audience and attendees.

At the conclusion of the listening session series, the administration will present a new strategic plan incorporating stakeholder feedback to the board.
