CCSD Welcomes Jeremy Carrick as Principal of Stall High

Charleston, SC — Charleston County School District (CCSD) is proud to announce and welcome Jeremy Carrick as the Principal of Stall High School. Carrick has served as the Interim Principal of Stall High since January 2017. He previously served as the Assistant Principal at Stall from 2011-2016.

During his time as Assistant Principal, Carrick was involved in a variety of program development at Stall. Specifically, Carrick organized and composed the *Challenge to Achieve* school improvement plan, which helped promote Personal Mastery model classrooms and increased participation in GearUp and Upward Bound programs. He also created a *Warrior Time* intervention period during the day to increase instructional time and provide small group support for students in all classes. Over the past few years, Carrick has devoted efforts toward collaborating with Stall's administrative team to transform school culture based on the *Capturing Kids' Hearts* program for which the school was selected as a 2015-2016 National Showcase School Nominee by the Flippen Group for their progress.

Prior to joining CCSD, Carrick was a high school science teacher for eight years at Fort Mill High where he designed and implemented curriculum as chairperson for his school's Curriculum and Instruction Focus Team in the areas of environmental science and chemistry. He also earned his National Board Certification and presented at the 2005 High Schools that Work

Conference on *Integrating Technology into the Science Classroom* during this time.

“Jeremy has done an excellent job leading the students and staff at Stall High,” said CCSD Superintendent Gerrita Postlewait. “We know he will continue to support and strongly lead Stall’s many outstanding programs.”

Under Carrick’s leadership, Stall served as a pilot school for a *WorkForce Academy* where several at-risk students participated in work-based learning opportunities, resulting in increased grade-point averages (GPAs) for those students, as well as a 50% decrease in discipline referrals. Carrick also led the Career and Technology Education (CTE) Department for the past three years, where he added two new CTE programs to the school, developed two career academies, and achieved a 100% increase in students reaching CTE Completer status.

Carrick holds a Bachelor of Science in Education Science from Clemson University and a Master’s in Educational Leadership from Winthrop University.
