He also co-captained a district-wide initiative to recruit teachers from around the country, which resulted in the hire of dozens of new teachers who relocated to Rochester. Furthermore, Bradley generated grants to fund the purchase of Smartboards in classrooms, sound systems to improve sound quality, as well as iPads® to facilitate instruction. He was also instrumental in fostering community partnerships and alliances, often creating community business ambassadors for schools such as a financial services firm that could provide educational seminars for parents, or a local church that could help provide school supplies and clothing.

Bradley holds a Bachelor of Science in Sociology and a Master of Science in Counseling Education from the University of Buffalo. He also holds a Master of Science in Educational Administration and a Doctor of Education and Executive Leadership from St. John Fisher College.
